

# To have

To have – in the present tense	
I	have
you	have
he, she, it	has*
we	have
you	have
they	have

**Remember**  
that there is an  
-s on the verb  
in 3rd person  
present tense!

To have – in the past tense	
I	had
you	had
he, she, it	had
we	had
you	had
they	had

**Note that the  
verb in past  
tense has only  
one form!**

I	have had
you	have had
he, she, it	has had*
we	have had
you	have had
they	have had

**Remember**  
that there is an  
–s on the  
auxiliary verb  
in 3rd person  
present  
perfect!

To have – in the pluperfect	
I	had had
you	had had
he, she, it	had had
we	had had
you	had had
they	had had

**Note that in  
the pluperfect  
there is only  
one form!**
